Reminders:

1. Not everyone is aware that in the Traditional Latin Mas,
 - a. we don't say *Amen* after receiving communion but get up and return to our pew.
 - b. responses to the priest's invocations are only given by the altar servers.
 - c. Gregorian chant of the Propers of the Mass are sung by the choristers.
The Ordinary and the Entrance and Recessional Hymns may be sung by all.
2. When going to communion, please do not lean on the gates of the Altar rail. They are not designed to support much weight. Leaning against them might open the gate and present a danger to both Priest and Communicant. The gates are not latched.

Free Douay Rheims Bible

The renowned Douay Rheims Bible is a favourite with many Catholics. It can be downloaded in p.d.f., html, or text format at the following web site <http://www.ccel.org/ccel/bible/douavr.pdf> It is useful to read from it on your computer screen or copying and printing selected pages but the size of it, 2602 pages, prohibits printing this entire Bible. The Challoner revision of the Douay-Rheims is still often the Bible of choice of more traditional English-speaking Catholics.

We received the following message from Mr. Frank Wagner:



Our Lady of Walsingham Statue

You may have wondered about a new Marian statue which graces the sanctuary of our church. It is the statue of *Our Lady of Walsingham* for which there exist a special devotion in the Ordinariate community which recently joined our parish. The rich symbology common to all exemplars of this statue is explained in the following picture.

Our Lady of Walsingham is a title of the Blessed Virgin Mary venerated by Roman Catholics and Anglicans associated with the Marian apparitions to Richeldis de Faverches, a pious English noblewoman, in 1061 in the village of Walsingham in Norfolk, England. Lady Richeldis had a building structure named "The Holy House" built in Walsingham which later became a shrine and place of pilgrimage.

In passing on his guardianship of the Holy House, Richeldis's son Geoffrey left instructions for the building of a priory in Walsingham. The priory passed into the care of the Canons Regular sometime between 1146 and 1174.

Pope Pius XII granted a canonical coronation to the Roman Catholic image via the papal nuncio, Bishop Gerald O'Hara, on 15 August 1954 with a gold crown funded by her female devotees, now venerated in the Basilica of Our Lady of Walsingham.

Liturgy

October is dedicated to *Our Lady of the Rosary*, whose feast day is October, 7th. This month is also dedicated to the Holy Angels. The traditional colours of Our Lady are azure blue and white, colours used for the page borders of this issue of our Newsletter.



Two other important feastdays this month are **Thanksgiving Day** and the feast of **Christ the King**.

By Canadian statute of 1957, Thanksgiving is a religious holiday in Canada to thank "Almighty God" for His bounty.

Next month, November, is dedicated to the holy souls in Purgatory. It is customary for people to offer up Masses for their faithfully departed family members or friends. Now is the time to ask Father to offer up a Mass for this intention. The diocese recommends a stipend of \$10 for a spoken Mass and \$15 for a sung Mass.

THE TROUBLED CATHOLIC CHURCH

The problems which plague our Catholic Church continue to be disclosed every day. The beginning of the problems predates Vatican II but become especially disastrous after the Council with the changes in the Liturgy, the New Mass. More than a hundred thousand priests left the priesthood and were laicized. Nearly a quarter million religious left their convents and cloisters. Even today some 1200 men and women abandon their vocation annually. Many of those who remain, like Sister Donna Quinn, depicted on the left, have become activist for liberal causes often in conflict with the Church's teachings. Sacrilegious Masses; the loss of faith by the "faithful" in the Real Presence of Jesus in the sacred species; the wide-spread practice of contraception and abortion amongst Catholics has left the Church in the worst condition of its 2000 year old existence. In Western Europe fewer than five percent of Catholics still practice their faith. Thousands of churches have been closed. "Parishes" of what is left of them have no priest to hear confessions, distribute communion and administer the other sacraments.
