Her body will be flown to Ontario where the Funeral and Burial services will be held in the Ukraine Byzantine Catholic St. Elias church in Brampton. Her remains will be buried there in the grave with her pre-deceased husband.

## **LITURGY**

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The feast of the Sacred Heart is on Friday, 28<sup>th</sup> June. Other feast days in June are Pentecost Sunday (9<sup>th</sup> June), Trinity Sunday (16<sup>th</sup> June), Corpus Christi (20<sup>th</sup> June) and the feast of St. Peter and Paul (29<sup>th</sup> June).

## **SACRED HEART DEVOTIONS**

There are a number of devotions that are recommended for this month for which we have created special booklets. Those can be downloaded from our website. They include a Litany of the Sacred Heart, a Chaplet, a Psalter (which is in our Sacred Heart booklet), an Act of Consecration, and Invocations (a Litany).

We recommend praying one or both of the following prayers during the month of June..

### **TRADITIONAL ACT OF REPARATION**

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on me.

O God, forgive me for all the sins of my life;

The sins of my youth and the sins of my age,

The sins of my body and the sins of my soul,

The sins I have confessed and the sins I have forgotten,

The sins against others in thought, word, and deed.

My sins of omission.

O, my God, I am sorry for all my sins, because Thou art so good;

And I will not sin again with the help of God.

God be merciful to me, a sinner.

Divine Heart of Jesus, convert sinners, save the dying,

Deliver the holy souls in purgatory.

### **Prayer before an Image or Picture of the Sacred Heart**

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, pour out Thy benedictions upon the Holy Church, upon its priests, and upon all its children. Sustain the just, convert the sinners, assist the dying, deliver the souls in purgatory, and extend over all hearts the sweet empire of Thy love. Amen.

## FIRST BLESSINGS BY A NEW PRIEST

A newly ordained priest can give First Blessings during the first year after his Ordination; No particular form of words is prescribed. But the following is by widespread custom often used.

*Per impositionem manuum mearum sacerdotalium et per intercessionem beatae Mariae semper Virginis, Sancti N et omnium Sanctorum, omni benedictione caelesti atque terrestri benedicat te Omnipotens Deus, Pater, et Filius, et Spiritus Sanctus. Amen.*

[By the imposition of my priestly hands and by the intercession of Blessed Mary ever Virgin, S N and all the Saints, may God Almighty bless you with every blessing both heavenly and earthly, the Father and the Son and the Holy Ghost. Amen.]

## Science, Scientism, and Spirituality

In a recent article Dr. Wolfgang Smith wrote the following:

“What distinguishes science from scientism, in my terminology, is the fact that scientific tenets are based upon empirical evidence — and are moreover *falsifiable* — whereas the claims of scientism, while pretending to be scientific, are actually founded upon ideological grounds. A textbook example would be **the Darwinist claim**, which proves to be both uncorroborated and unfalsifiable empirically. Yet there hardly exists a so-called “natural science” these days which is not *de facto* permeated with scientistic tenets of various kinds. And as regards the prevailing worldview — our supposedly “scientific” *Weltanschauung* [world-view], touted to rest on the so-called “hard facts of science” — a modest inquiry suffices to disclose that it is actually scientistic to the core.”

In this one paragraph he shows why Darwin’s so-called Theory of Evolution is unscientific. Yet it is well-known that many, if not most, of the Catholic clergy believe it to be a true science. He goes on to show that beliefs in false scientistic ideas adversely affect one’s Catholic faith.

In his latest book, titled *Physics & Vertical Causation*, Dr. Smith has proven that much of today’s science is driven by an atheistic ideology and thus has failed in being able to explain scientific findings in various areas. His book and a soon to be released documentary movie are destined to cause a major change in future scientific education, theory and experiments. It will also have a profound influence on religious thinking, especially Thomistic philosophy and metaphysics. Modern Scientific thinking which has been bogged down by false premises will be able to make progress again into a true understanding of God’s created world.
