

3. A Strange Light Appeared in The Night Sky

Eighty-two years ago, a strange light appeared in the night sky. It delivered a warning to the world but was ignored and soon forgotten. Perhaps there was no one who understood its significance. That became clear much later on.

The strange light appeared in the sky at nine o'clock in the evening on Tuesday, 25 January, 1938, and it remained in sight until two o'clock in the morning. During that time, the sky was illumined with a strange red glow, as if lit by a flame. It was seen in many European countries, in North Africa, in Canada and in the United States of America. People who saw it thought that it might have been caused by an enormous fire. Amongst the observers was a little nine-year old girl. She watched the sky together with a small crowd of neighbours. They guessed about where this light came from. They thought that there must be a huge fire on the other side of the mountain. Today, eighty-two years later, that little girl is an elderly lady who attends the Traditional Latin Mass at Our Lady, Queen of Peace Church in Victoria. She still remembers what happened that day.

The next morning, all the newspapers reported on that light. Most of them described it as a huge aurora borealis (the northern lights). The "Bulletin de la Société Astronomique de France" described it as follows: "A blueish green glow, pale and pretty, covered the sky from the north-east to the north-west. Gradually, the sky above lit up and formed an irregular, red vault. A sort of crimson cloud formed at the north-east and moved towards the north-west as if pushed by a mysterious breath of wind. It moved back, undulated, expanded, faded, rekindled, while huge jets, whose colour changed from blood-red to orange-red to yellow, soared towards the zenith."

Another paper described it as an *aurora borealis* of exceptional magnitude which furrowed the skies of Western Europe. The sky was alighted like an enormous open fire in movement, creating a vivid blood-red glow. The edge of the fire was white, as if the sun was about to rise. Doubtless, it was an *aurora borealis*. Even today, the astronomers are divided as to the origins of this phenomenon because nothing similar has ever been seen before.

Going back twenty-one years before this event, three shepherd children in Fátima received the following message from Our Lady:

*If men do not refrain from offending God, another and more terrible war will begin during the pontificate of Pius XI. **When you see a night that is lit by a strange and unknown light**, you will know it is the sign God gives you that He is about to punish the world by war and by hunger, and by the persecution of the Church and the Holy Father.*

Sr. Lucia denied that it was an aurora borealis. She would know better.

Another interesting fact is that the regions where the glow was visible corresponded exactly to the zone of Christianity which was about to be set afflicted by the Second World War!

Today God is being offended in ways worse than at any time in history, perhaps worst of all by the prelates in the Vatican, and even through the Holy Father himself.

As at Fátima, Our Lady has appeared and given warnings many times since then. One warning was to a nun, a convert from Buddhism, in Akita, Japan, to whom she said:

The work of the devil will infiltrate even into the Church in such a way that one will see cardinals opposing cardinals and bishops fighting against other bishops. ... The Church will be full of those who accept compromises, and the devil will press many priests and consecrated souls to leave the service of the Lord.
