In addition to Masses, the website also occasionally streams compline, vespers, and a Holy Hour. An exact schedule can be found on the website.

We received the following message from our Seminarian.

Due to the Coronavirus pandemic, myself and the rest of the seminarians have returned home from the seminary. I will be in Victoria for the foreseeable future, until this crisis abates. Alas that access to the Sacraments, especially the Mass, is so impeded; but I am trying to do what I can! The Office, the Rosary, and much spiritual reading are keeping my soul alive.

St. Thomas mentions (Summa Theologiae IIIa, Q. 65, A. 3, corpus), rather interestingly, that Confirmation is ordered to the Eucharist in that we should not fear to abstain from It (or be away from It); we are soldiers of Christ and need not fear! This is a chance for us to truly appreciate our Confirmation and the graces that come from it; plus, a chance to make spiritual communions - and a chance to re-appreciate the value of the Blessed Sacrament; how we should rejoice when we do receive it!

5. Financial crises

The COVID19 health crisis has caused another serious crisis, a financial crisis, for many people and organisations. This has affected some of our T.L.M. members who have been laid off. It is also affecting our Parish and Diocese and our seminarians and their Seminaries.

For those of us who are not affected and most likely will not in the foreseeable future, such as some pensioners, may be able to assist those in need. If you belong to those fortunate people who are not facing a loss of income we propose the following actions:

The parish: Put your regular contribution in the weekly envelopes and drop them all those envelopes in the Sunday collection basket when Sunday Masses resume.

Our Seminarian: Write out a cheque to **Kent Grealy** and hand it to him personally when he attends Mass again with us and before he returns to his Seminary. Should he leave before our Masses resume then deposit your cheque in the **Seminarian Fund** box on the refectory table in the hall after Sunday Mass. Mr. Grealy is faced with the extra cost of plane tickets for travelling from and to the Seminary.

The poor: At this time we cannot tell you if the parish has an active program of assisting those in need. If not, then we assume, the parish could activate one again and we could make contributions there as well. It is a Christian duty to help the poor.

Alphonsus de Liguori:

receive Thee sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.

I embrace Thee as if Thou wert already there and unite myself
wholly to Thee. Never permit me to be separated from Thee.
Amen.

I planted you, my vineyard,
And cared for you most tenderly;

Then listen to my pleading
And do not turn away from me.
You are my people: will you reject me?
For you I suffer bitterly.
