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Mass schedule

Until further notice, we will no longer publish a list of all the Masses in this Newsletter as we have done in the past. The greater number of Masses each month would require too much space in this Newsletter. Mr. Rob McBride Has recently been sending **a weekly schedule** to his subscribers. If you are not yet on his distribution list, we suggest you request him to add your e-mail address (Rob McBride yodi@telus.net).

Since it is important to pray the Mass, including the Propers, you will need to know which Mass is being offered on a particular day. You can find this information on a liturgical calendar, like the one published by the F.S.S.P. But this cannot tell you what is the selection made by the priest for votive Masses. Such information must come from the local Parish. Therefore, we will attempt to place on our website a Weekly Schedule for the Masses celebrated during the coming week. That should allow you to retrieve the Propers for any day, be it a Sunday or a weekday. For further information, we refer to News Item No. 3.

1. About this Newsletter

This is the fifth special Website-only edition of the regular monthly Newsletter for the Traditional Latin Mass congregation. We are still not permitted to bring printed copies into the church. When this ruling is removed, we will promptly make printed copies available again.

2. Mass Schedule

Masses start at 8.00 a.m. on all weekdays (except Saturdays when there is **usually** no Latin Mass), and at 8.00 a.m. and noon on Sundays.

3. Mass Propers

For those who have no *Daily Missal* we recommend that you print a copy of the Mass Propers, including Commemorations, if any from the following web site: https://tridentine-mass.blogspot.com/search/ They are posted daily at 12.30 a.m. Note that Propers and Commemorations may not always match those used at the local parishes, as Priests may, on certain days, choose to celebrate a different Mass, such as a votive Mass. You may also get the Propers of the Mass from the Missalettes on our website. You can download the complete Missalette and then extract the particular Propers for that day.

4. LiveMass.net

For those who prefer the safety of their home and follow a Latin Mass Livestreamed, we offer the following suggestions. (Note: *Livestreamed* Masses can be followed only at the time when celebrated)

<u>LiveMass.net</u> is an apostolate of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter (F.S.S.P.). The website streams the Tridentine Latin Mass five times each weekday and eight times each Sunday. In addition to Masses, the website also occasionally streams Vespers, Compline, and a Holy Hour. An exact schedule can be found on the website. Select a time which best suits you and your family members as there are Masses starting at different times. All of them are rendered as Pacific Time, which is our time zone.

We recommend that you click on the following link of the Institute of Christ the King, Sovereign Priests (I.C.R.) in Gricigliano where our seminarian Abbé Julian Malinowski is studying https://www.icrsp.org/direct/ Its Missa Cantata on Sundays is very beautiful. The Mass is assisted by a number of Altar servers and a small choir. There is no sermon, but a separate link is provided for a sermon in the French tongue. This Mass is not *livestreamed* but it can be followed at a time of your convenience.)

The Month of September is especially dedicated to our the Seven Dolours of our Lady, the feastday of which is 15th September. On our website you will find the devotional prayers and booklets for the following feastdays:

Tuesday, 8th September is the feastday of the **Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary**,

Saturday, 12th September is the feastday of The Most Holy Name of Mary

Monday, 14th September is the feastday of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

Tuesday, 15th September is the feastday of the **Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary**.

Tuesday, 29th September is the Solemn Feast of St. Michael and All Angels, or 'Michaelmas'.

DEVOTIONS

LITTLE OFFICE OF THE SEVEN DOLOURS OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This Little Office consists of Matins, the night hour, plus six of the day hours. There is no Lauds. To give you a sense of this devotion we print here only Matins. The complete text can be read or downloaded from our website. We suggest that you pray this devotion at least once a week but especially on our Lay's feastday, 15th September.

This devotion is intended for private use only.



The Office of the Seven Dolours of our Lady may be prayed on any day but is especially suited to use in September, the Month of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin, and on Saturdays in Lent.

MATINS: Midnight

(or anticipated to the previous afternoon)

First Dolour: The Prophecy of Holy Simeon (St. Luke 2. 33-35).

Ave.

- **y**. Thou shalt ★ open my lips, O Lord.
- **R.** And my mouth shall shew forth Thy praise.
- ✓. Incline

 unto mine aid, O God.
- **R.** O Lord, make haste to help me.
- **V.** [Bowing:] Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost,
- **R.** [Unbowing:] As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

From Easter Sunday until Septuagesima Sunday: Alleluia.

From Septuagesima Sunday until Easter: Praise be to Thee, O Lord, King of everlasting glory.

Hymn.

Hail to thee, Christ's mother dearest,
Who, by sad prophetic word,
In the sacred temple hearest
Of the keen heart-piercing sword.
Make me mindful of thy sorrow,
