A SCRIPTURAL DEVOTION FOR ASCENSIONTIDE

Pater. Ave.

- 1. Jesus led them out as far as Bethania: and, lifting up His Hands, He blessed them (St. Luke 24.50-51). *Three* Glorys.
- 2. He said unto them: All power is given unto Me in Heaven and on earth. Go, therefore, teach ye all nations, baptising them in the Name of the Father + and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost (St. Matthew 28. 18-19). *Three* Glorys.
- 3. Teach them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you (St. Matthew 28. 20). *Three* Glorys.
- 4. He that believeth and is baptised will be saved (St. Mark 16. 16). *Three* Glorys.
- 5. But he that believeth not shall be condemned (St. Mark 16. 16). *Three* Glorys.
- 6. And behold, I am with you all days, even unto the consummation of the world. (St. Matthew 28. 20). *Three* Glorys.

- 7. Having said these things, while they looked on, Jesus was raised up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight (Acts 1. 9). *Three* Glorys.
- 8. And while they were beholding Him going up into Heaven, behold, two men stood by them in white garments (Acts 1. 10). *Three* Glorys.
- 9. Who said to them: Ye men of Galilee, why stand you looking up to Heaven? This Jesus Who is taken up from you into Heaven shall so come as you have seen Him going into Heaven (Acts 1. 11). *Three* Glorys.
- 10. And Jesus was taken up into Heaven and sitteth on the right hand of God (St. Mark 16. 19). *Three* Glorys.
- ♥ God is ascended with jubilee, alleluia!
 And the Lord with the sound of the trumpet, alleluia!

Three Glorys.

Three Glorys close each scriptural verse, and an additional three are prayed after the versicle and its response. So the total number of Glorys is thirty-three, the number of years our Blessed Lord sojourned on earth. The ten verses stand for the ten days of Ascensiontide, from the time of our Lord's ascent into Heaven until the time of the coming down of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Each set of three Glorys honour the Blessed Trinity.
