2. A Review of 2021, and a Preview of 2022

This past year, Like the previous one, as seen a growth in the number of people who regularly attend the Traditional Latin Mass (T.L.M.) in our Parish. The same has happened generally throughout the world. The reasons for this growth are well-known. One is that, in difficult times, people tend to take their faith more seriously. During times of pandemic, when death is more threatening, there will also be a longing for a more authentic practice of the faith, one that is rooted in the venerable customs and traditions of generations of faithful who have been inspired by God the Holy Spirit.

Someone attending the T.L.M. for the first time is typically impressed by the great dignity and God-centredness in which the Mass is being celebrated. The prayers remind us that the Mass is an unbloody re-enactment of the Holy Sacrifice of Calvary, in which God is appeased by the perfect will of Jesus continually to endure suffering and death to secure our redemption. Newcomers are often struck by the beauty of the sanctuary, its Altar and its Altar rail; the Gregorian chant and sacred polyphony; and the great reverence of the Priest, altar servers and those in the pews. The prayers of the T.L.M. and its direction of worship are God-centred, and thus engender a real encounter with our Blessed Lord.

The future looks uncertain for the T.L.M. and we may face an eventual change to our Mass which we have come to love so much. Should any critical change come to our Mass without warning, please visit our website <https://latinmassvictoria.com> for major news related to our Mass

LITURGY

The entire month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. There are three important feast days. This year they occur on the 2nd, 6th and 9th of January, when we celebrate, respectively, the Feasts of the Holy Name of Jesus; the Solemn Feast of the Epiphany; and the Feast of the Holy Family.

2nd January – Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus

The importance of this Feastday follows from the text in the second letter of St. Paul to the Philippians

[10] That in the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth.

6th January – Solemn Feast of Epiphany

This feast outranked even Christmas Day before 1962 and was a holy day of obligation in Canada before 1968. *Epiphany* means *manifestation*. This day celebrates the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles and hence to the whole world, as He was symbolically revealed to the Jews by the shepherds on the day of His Nativity. The three kings (Magi) gave symbolic gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, representing His kingship, His Godhead and His Eternal Sacrifice. Gold pertains to kings; frankincense is used as incense to honour God at His Altar; myrrh is used to perfume the bodies of the departed.

9th January – Feast of the Holy Family

A Remarkable Feat of Inspiration

In the third paragraph of that article, the author writes about these words from Isaiah **40 .1 (K.J.V.)**.

All that [those words], of course, has inspired and encouraged the world for nearly 3000 years, which has included many moments even more troubled than our own deeply bewildered age. Just a few centuries ago, it gave Georg Friedrich Handel the inspiration for his *Messiah*, which many of us will hear in this season. A servant stumbled in on Handel just as he finished writing the [Hallelujah Chorus](#) and found him in tears: “I did think I did see all Heaven before me, and the great God Himself.” If you are prone to doubt divine inspiration, consider: **Handel produced that immortal 260-page score in just twenty-four days.**

A believer in God knows that the inspiration comes from God.

An Atheists thinks that the neuronal synapses were just fortuitously firing ionic impulses in Handle’s brain during all those twenty-four days. Yes, of course, a very ‘scientific’ explanation!
