NEWS

1. First Priest from the U.V.V.I.A.

We received the great news from Deacon Kent Grealy that his ordination to the priesthood will take place on May 27, 2022 at 10.00 a.m. North American Martyrs Catholic Church Lincoln, Nebraska. He will celebrate his First Solemn Mass on Saturday, May 28, 2022 at 9.30 a.m. at Our Lady Guadeloupe Seminary. He extends an invitation to anyone of us and request to R.S.V.P. by April 25. 2. About our seminarians

Deacon Kent Grealy received his vocation to the priesthood while studying at the University of Victoria and attending the Traditional Latin Mass in our Parish. He will be the first newly-ordained priest in our Diocese in a long time.

Please pray also for our second seminarian, Abbé Julian Malinowski, to be ordained in the Traditional Rite in another three or four years. He likewise received his call to the priesthood while studying at the University of Victoria and attending the T.L.M. here at Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish.

Please pray fervently and frequently that both of them become holy priests. Pray also that even more vocations may come out of our congregation, both for the priesthood and for the religious life.

3. Meeting of the *Una Voce Vancouver Island Association* U.V.V.I.A.

On Passion Sunday, April 3, we plan to hold a general meeting of the membership for the first time in two years due to the Covid virus restrictions. At this meeting a new Board of Directors will be elected and members will be offered a brief overview of the rationale and activities of the Association. We hope that all current members will make an effort to attend this meeting. Those who aren't a member as yet are also welcome. They sign can up for a free membership at the meeting if they so wish. The meeting starts about 20 minutes after the sung Mass, in the adjacent meeting room.

6. Pro-Life & Pro-Family = Pro-God

You may have asked yourself why this Newsletter contains every month news under the foregoing headline. The answer is that both the right to life and the family have been under attack for many years, even decades now, and that these attacks continue to grow in intensity. In several apparitions, Our Lady has warned the world that God will deliver a great chastisement unless people stop killing the innocent unborn, the elderly and those suffering from disabilities. More recently, there have even been attacks made against the family structure itself, such as the right of parents to protect their children from learning about the immoral practices in school. We cannot be indifferent to those attacks on Life and on Family. On Judgement Day, we shall be held responsible if we fail to act against all these evils.

7. The U.V.V.I.A., the U.V.C. and the F.I.U.V.

Those who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass (T.L.M.) at Our Lady Queen of Peace Parish should know that, at no cost, they can sign up for membership in the *Una Voce Vancouver Island Association*, the (U.V.V.I.A.) We are associated with *Una Voce Canada* (U.V.C.) by virtue of our close working relationship with that organisation. The U.V.C. is a member of the *International Una Voce Federation* the F.I.U.V., English for **F**oederatio **I**nternationalis **U**na **V**oce.

There is strength in numbers when dealing with secular and religious institutions and organisations, especially when trying to obtain, maintain or secure certain rights.

For example, the establishment of Traditional Latin Masses in many parishes has often been near impossible owing to the obstruction or lack of co-operation of the local Parish Priest, his Bishop or even the Vatican.

The U.V.V.I.A. is not a registered charitable organisation, and, as such, it cannot issue tax receipts for donations or gifts in support of the Parish. This is why, since the restoration of the T.L.M. on Easter Sunday, 2008, our parishioners have always made generous donations to the U.V.C. to purchase traditional paraments and other needed goods for worthy celebrations of the traditional liturgies. We made this arrangement so that the U.V.C. would become the owner of those goods, and we lent them to our Parish while donors could get tax receipts. Given the uncertainties of the early days, and we until this day, about the continuation of the Traditional Latin Mass at our Parish, this ownership arrangement secured of all those goods except for the restored altar rail, for which our T.L.M. congregation paid the lion's share. One member of our congregation, the custodian, who is also a member of the U.V.C., is assigned the duty of looking after the proper use and care of those goods on behalf of the U.V.C., especially in case of a discontinuation of the Latin Mass.

8. Interview by *Calx Mariae* with Dr. Joseph Shaw

On page 4 of this issue, we bring you the fourth Question and Answer session (Q&A-4) of an interview by *Calx Mariae* of Dr. Joseph Shaw.

Calx Mariae is a British organisation which, as posted on its website <https://voiceofthefamily.com/>, is “A lay initiative formed to defend Catholic Teaching on the Family”.

Dr Joseph Shaw is well known to the readers of “Voice of the Family” as a regular contributor to the Digest. In October, 2021, Dr Shaw was elected President of the *Una Voce Federation*, a lay movement that promotes and defends the Traditional Latin Mass worldwide. Dr Shaw holds a doctorate in Philosophy from Oxford University, where he also currently teaches.

He has published on Ethics and Philosophy of Religion and has edited [*The Case for Liturgical Restoration: Una Voce Position Papers on the Extraordinary Form*](#) (Angelico Press). He is the Chairman of the Latin Mass Society of England and Wales and the father of nine children.

LITURGY

This year the liturgical season changes from Lent to Eastertide on 17th April, in the middle of month. On Easter Sunday, the first day of the Paschal Season and of the shorter five weeks of Eastertide, several changes occur in the Sacred Liturgy, both at Mass and in the Divine Office. For example, on Holy Saturday evening, the *Angelus* is replaced by the *Regina Cæli*; and also, at a Sung Mass, the *Asperges* is replaced by the beautiful *Vidi Aquam*. They change back on the eve of the Feast of the Holy Trinity, which is the Saturday following Pentecost. During Paschaltide, there will be two Sequences, the *Victimæ Paschali Laudes* during Easter week and the *Veni Sancte Spiritus* in Whitsuntide (Pentecost Week).

DEVOTIONS

During the first half of April we are still in Lent. Lenten devotions can be accessed or downloaded from our website at the DEVOTIONS web-page under the heading LENT. On the same webpage under the heading EASTER are posted the devotions for that season. On 8th April, we celebrate the feastday of Our Lady of Sorrows. We suggest you read the interesting document, titled [Liturgical Notes on the Feasts of the Seven Sorrows](#) from the New Liturgical Movement web site.

The month of April is dedicated to the **Blessed Sacrament**. A **Litany of the Blessed Sacrament** can also be found on the Devotions webpage of our website. (Note that the website is being updated. Return at a later time if this is not accessible when you try to access it.)

Q&A-4

C.M. 4: People familiar with *Una Voce*'s work associate it with Catholic tradition and the restoration of Christian civilisation and culture. But what is the ideal that *Una Voce* is striving for? What would success look like?

J.S.: The aim of the *Una Voce* movement is simple: the restoration of the ancient Mass to the Church's altars. This need not imply the disappearance of other liturgical forms. Pope Benedict [XVI] thought that the attempt to stamp out the older Mass was a mistake, and it is surely not unreasonable to agree with him. Catholics should be able to discover it, he said: and that means it needs to be widely available.

We also want celebrations of the liturgy to be as reverent and solemn as possible, and for as many people as possible to be moved to attend them. As already noted, this is what most of the practical work of *Una Voce* groups consists in: singing, serving, mending vestments, cleaning churches, organising pilgrimages, arranging training for people in different roles, and advertising events, and answering questions about the *Usus Antiquior* in accordance with our abilities and expertise.

The laity has always been involved in the liturgical life of the Church, and the *Una Voce* movement continues the tradition of the numerous guilds and sodalities which have supported the worthy celebration of the liturgy over the centuries.

The liturgy is not the whole of Catholic culture, but it is an indispensable and fundamental component of it. This means that the restoration of the Traditional liturgy has further implications for Catholic life and culture.
