LITURGY

The month of October is dedicated to *Our Lady of the Rosary*, whose feastday is 7th October. The traditional colours of Our Lady are azure blue and white, colours used for the page borders of this issue of our Newsletter.

October is the only month of the year which has two dedications instead of one. The second dedication is that of the *Holy Guardian Angels*, whose feastday is celebrated on 2nd October. This dedication is much older than that of the Holy Rosary.

A third important feast day is that of *Christ the King* which is always celebrated on the last Sunday in October in the Traditional Roman calendar which we follow. (In the *Novus Ordo* liturgy it is celebrated on the last Sunday before Advent).

The feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as a reminder that Christ ought to reign not only over individuals and families, but also over peoples and nations. He wrote in *Quas Primas* that “it is necessary that the kingship of our Saviour should be as widely as possible recognized and understood, and to that end *nothing would serve better than the institution of a special feast in honour of the Kingship of Christ.*”

His predecessor, Pope Leo XIII, had already spoken of the blessings and the concord that result from the recognition of Christ’s right in Civil Society. The French revolution was an attempt to de-throne Christ through persecution of the Church, the *Bride of Christ*. It was an attempt to eliminate any vestige of Catholic civilisation. Social unrest, disunity and wars increased as societies worked to establish a world based on atheistic, materialistic principles. Pius XI’s purpose, a mere seven years after the end of the “Great War,” was to cut to the very heart of contemporary geopolitical ills and lay the blame on a stubborn humanity’s rejection of the Saviour Himself. To advance the truth that Jesus Christ must reign in society if we are to have that “tranquillity of order” that we call “peace” was the Holy Father’s goal in establishing this beautiful feast.

In one Dutch home the family had a statue of Christ and below it an embroidered cloth with the words “*In deze woning, is Christus Koning*”, translated as ‘*In this home, Christ is King*’. There was peace and unity in that home.

The *Collect* of the Mass reads:

Almighty and everlasting God, who in Thy beloved Son, the King of the Universe, hast willed to restore all things: mercifully grant that all the families of the nations, separated by the wound of sin, may be brought under His most sweet sovereignty.

DEVOTIONS

Probably one of the most practiced devotion is that of praying the Holy Rosary. It has been endorsed by many saints and Popes, and by Our Lady herself who asked us to pray the rosary on many occasions, in particular, through the visionaries of Fatima. There she insistently asked the little shepherds to pray the *rosary* every day, offering their prayer for the peace in the world. She asked that we pray the Rosary daily for peace, the conversion of sinners, the souls in Purgatory and to make the Consecration to her Immaculate Heart with the Devotion of the First Saturday of the Month in reparation for the 5 offences against her Immaculate Heart.

As Our Blessed Mother said to Blessed Alan de la Roche, “When you say your Rosary, the angels rejoice, the Blessed Trinity delights in it, my Son finds joy in it too, and I myself am happier than you can possibly guess. After the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, there is nothing in the Church that I love as much as the Rosary.”

St. (Padre) Pio addressed to one of his devotees, Lucietta Pennelli, the following quotes:

- *“Today I have already said 16 complete Rosaries.”*
- *“Pray the rosary frequently. It costs so little, and it’s worth so much!”*
- *“We can’t live without the Rosary.”*
- *“Say the rosary, and pray it every day.”*
- *“The Rosary is the weapon of defence and salvation.”*
- *“The Rosary is the weapon given us by Mary to use against the tricks of the infernal enemy.”*
- *“Mary has recommended the Rosary at Lourdes and Fatima because of its exceptional value for us and our times.”*
- *“The rosary is the prayer of the Madonna, the one that triumphs on everything and everybody.”*
- *“Always recite the rosary and recite it as often as possible.”*
- *“Mary is present in every mystery of the rosary.”*
- *“Satan always tries to destroy the rosary, but he will never succeed.”*
- *“Mary has taught us the rosary just as Jesus taught us the Our Father”.*
- *“I always pray for the sick. Every day I say a holy Rosary for them.”*
- *Hold on tightly to the Rosary. Be very grateful to the Madonna because it was she who gave us Jesus.*
- *Love our Lady and make her loved; always recite the Rosary and recite it as often as possible.*

The importance of praying the daily rosary cannot be overstated, especially the family together.
