1. Election Meeting of the U.V.V.I.A.

2. Support for our Seminarians

3. A Prayer Crusade for our T.L.M. Congregation

The Prayer Crusade for the growth and preservation of the T.L.M. is off to a good start with the number of participants who already signed up in the first week. The sign-up sheet will be placed on the table in the back of the church during the next three or four weeks and then once every month after that, for new participants to sign up.

Instead of a weekly litany, or in addition to it, you may prefer to **pray a Novena** (or two) every month. We suggest that you start your Novena(s) on a fixed day of the week, e.g., on the first and/or third Sunday of the month, then the novena will always end on the Monday of the following week. That day can then easily be remembered.

The prayer intention is: For the Preservation and Growth of the Latin Mass world-wide and especially here in Victoria.

The participation of all members of our congregation will ensure that on every day of the month one or more members will be praying to St. Joseph. Please join us in this prayer crusade.

This Prayer Crusade will continue until, hopefully, one day we will have a fully-recognised parish status for our T.L.M. congregation.

4. Dark clouds on the horizon and faith and trust in God's Goodness

At this time, there are reliable rumours that the celebration of the Traditional Latin Mass will be subjected to further restrictions which could affect our congregation. Should this happen, then we know that God will never abandon us and will restore the ancient Mass, the Mass of all times, at some time in the future. Meanwhile, we can attend worthily celebrated Masses of the Ordinariate congregation or that of the Ukrainian, both of whose are God-centred instead of being focussed on the congregation. We have faith and trust in God's promises that he will always be with us. One day the T.L.M. will be restored in greater glory.

While our T.L.M. congregation has nearly tripled in weekly attendance of our Sunday Mass, the *Novus Ordo* (New) Mass has been declining in numbers in most parishes. The same is happening all over the world.

Vocations for the priesthood are booming in the T.L.M. communities while they are down to a trickle in the New Mass communities. The T.L.M. congregations are attended by many young men and women and many children from mid-sized families. The young people have mostly abandoned the N.O. parishes which are rapidly dying out and closed down. The stark difference in the beliefs and practices of their respective attendees is evident from a 2018 study: **Traditional Latin Mass National Survey** (<u>https://liturgyguy.com/2019/02/24/national-survey-results-what-we-learned-aboutlatin-mass-attendees/</u>) from which we show here the statistical results.

The T.L.M. Survey was designed to parallel questions posed in previous research, allowing a direct comparison between the T.L.M. attendees and those of the N.O.M..

Note that this study is nearly five years old. If a similar study were undertaken in 2023 the contrast might even be greater since many of the more traditional NO members are now attending the T.L.M.

LITURGY

The month of March is dedicated to **St. Joseph**, **spouse of the Blessed Virgin Marry** and Patron Saint of the Church Universal since 1847. His feastdays is fixed on the **19th March**. This year that feastday falls on a Sunday and is, therefore, transferred to Monday, 20th March. Since Mondays are a day off for priests in our Diocese, there will be no Mass on that day.

The other significant feastday is that of the **Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin on 25th March**. That day falls on a Saturday this year, which again, is a day when Father does not celebrate a Latin Mass. Thus both of these significant feastdays will this year be without a Traditional Latin Mass. We have not checked if the Ordinariate congregation celebrates a Mass on those days.

Nevertheless, we can, in the spirit of Holy Church, pray devotions to St. Joseph and to Our Blessed Lady. For St. Joseph's feastday we will post the following booklet on our website (<u>https://latinmassvictoria.com/devotions/</u>), namely, <u>St. Joseph's Devotional booklet, Rev.1</u>. We suggest praying daily the short *Prayer to St. Joseph* on the next page.

For the feastday of the Annunciation on 25th March, we recommend the booklet, *The Little Office of the Blessed Virgin Mary*. In her honour you can offer to her the *SALUTATIONS TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY OF ST. JOHN EUDES*
