3. What does it take to be Catholic - A reminder

A Catholic must accept fully and follow both the Church's dogmatic teaching and the moral truths revealed by God. Therefore, whoever rejects even one of those revealed truths—whether of a dogmatic or moral nature—rejects the entire deposit of the Faith and expels himself from the Church. Every revealed truth, without exception, must be accepted.

This is what Pope Leo XIII teaches in the encyclical *Satis Cognitum*, on the unity of the Church:

[The Church has always] regarded as rebels and expelled from the ranks of her children all who held beliefs on any point of doctrine different from her own....

He who dissents even in one point from divinely revealed truth absolutely rejects all faith, since he thereby refuses to honour God as the supreme Truth and the formal motive of faith.

LITURGY

The month of October is dedicated to *Our Lady of the Rosary*, whose feastday is 7th October. The traditional colours of Our Lady are azure blue and white, colours used for the page borders of this issue of our Newsletter.

The Holy Rosary is one of the most powerful spiritual weapons for the conversion of sinners and also to fight evil in the world. At Fatima, the Blessed Virgin Mary identified herself to Lucia, saying, "I am the Lady of the Rosary". A dramatic example of her power is the defeat of the Muslim fleet by a much smaller group of vessels fighting for the Church at Lepanto in1571. In this conflict, praying the rosary gained our side the victory. A more recent example occurred in 1957 in Austria. We will explain this in our next newsletter.

We recommend that, this month, you consider becoming a member of the *Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary*, which is directed by the Dominican Friars in their Province of St. Joseph. Go to their website at https://rosaryconfraternity.org/ to learn more about, enrol, and benefit from this Confraternity.

As Pope Leo XIII said in his encyclical on the Confraternity, "whenever a person fulfils his obligation of reciting the Rosary according to the rule of the Confraternity, he includes in his intentions all its members, and they, in turn, render him the same service many times over. 'Each member' includes deceased fellow members as well; and thus, he knows that, in turn, he will be included in the prayers of hundreds of thousands both now and hereafter." This led the Cure d'Ars to say: "If anyone has the happiness of being in the Confraternity of the Rosary, he has in all corners of the world brothers and sisters who pray for him".

The month of October is also dedicated to the **Holy Angels**. This makes October the only month in which there are two dedications.

Two other important feastdays this month are **Thanksgiving Day** and the feast of **Christ the King**.

Note that Thanksgiving Day is a **religious holiday** in Canada by statute of 1957. On 9th **October,** we give thanks to God for His bounty. Thanksgiving is a statutory holiday in Canada. A new statutory holiday has been established for Monday,2nd October It is called *Truth and Reconciliation Day*. Enough said!

Finally, **October is also Mission Month.** Faithful Catholics know about the importance of the missions and the work of missionaries through which countless souls have come to know the truth and beauty of our Catholic faith. Pray for our missionary priests, religious and lay workers, that God may protect them and bless their work abundantly.

2nd October: Feast of the Holy Guardian Angels --- That every individual soul has a guardian angel has never been defined by the Church, and is, consequently, not an article of faith; but it is the 'mind of the

Church' as St. Jerome expressed it: "how great the dignity of the soul, since each one has from his birth, an angel commissioned to guard it." (Comm. in Matt., xviii, lib. II).

On Wednesday, 11th **October**, the feast of the Motherhood of our Lady, our weekly Mass will be celebrated on this day instead of on the Friday of the same week.

The Fatima Angel Prayers

The Pardon Prayer

The angel who appeared to the children called himself "the Angel of Peace" and "the Angel of Portugal." He taught them the following prayer:

My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee! I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee.

The Angel's Prayer

On one occasion, the three children saw the angel prostrate himself before a host and chalice that hung in the air. Worshiping the Eucharist, the angel prayed:

Most Holy Trinity—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifferences whereby He is offended. And through the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners.

The Blessed Mother stressed the critical importance of praying the Rosary daily for the conversion of sinners and for peace in the world. She asked that the following prayer be recited at the end of each Rosary decade:
