We will be increasing our funding to each Canadian Seminarian at both the F.S.S.P. and the I.C.R. to \$3,000 per *annum*. (It was \$2,000/year.)

In other news reported by U.V.C.,:

- Julian Malinowski is one of the Canadian seminarians, at the Institute of Christ the King (I.C.R.) Seminary at Gricigliano, Italy, whom we support. Julian was born in Calgary but lived in Esquimalt, on Vancouver Island, prior to becoming a seminarian. His ordination to the Priesthood is expected to be conferred in 2025, God willing.
- For the Fraternity of St. Peter (F.S.S.P.), we also have a new seminarian from the Archdiocese of Vancouver. He will begin his studies this September.

3. News from Abbé Julian Malinowski

i. to his benefactors

“I give thanks to my God in every memory of you always, in every prayer making supplication for you all with joy: for your participation in the gospel of Christ from the first day until now: confident of this very thing, that He, who hath begun a good work in you, will perfect it unto the day of Christ Jesus.” Phil 1:3-6

Fratres,

Thanks and glory be to God in all things. **I received the grace of diaconal ordination not two weeks ago from Mgr. Glen Provost, bishop of Lake Charles.** [Lake Charles is a city in southwest Louisiana.] That God has led me thus far down the path of priesthood is obviously an unmerited grace (as are all graces), but especially so for this sinner. This generosity and goodness of God, far from discouraging me, only inspires me to a greater confidence in the aid God brings to his children.

During the rite of ordination, the bishop imposes one hand on the head of the deacon-to-be, and says “Accipe Spiritum Sanctum ad robur, et ad resistendum diabolo et tentationibus eius: in nomine Domini.” (“Receive the Holy Spirit unto strength, and unto resistance of the devil and his temptations: in

the name of the Lord.”) A little later, the bishop prays over the ordained: “In moribus eorum praecepta fulgeant, ut suae castitatis exemplo imitationem sanctam plebs acquirat.” (In their conduct, let thy precepts shine forth, so that the people may imitate the example of their chastity.” Perhaps this prayer was inspired by St. Paul’s admonition to St. Timothy: “Let no man despise thy youth: but be thou an example of the faithful, in word, in conversation, in charity, in faith, in chastity” (1 Tim 4:12). Please pray that I may be faithful to this gift of grace in the spiritual combat, and in manifesting an exemplary Christian life of virtue.

Dr. Smith was a man of gravity, distinction, and intellectual power—a guiding light and inspiration to readers all over the world in these confusing times. It is our honour to be able to continue to make his work known and available, and it has been our profound privilege to bring him to the attention of so many new audiences in these last several years of his long and fruitful life.

You should know that Wolfgang’s greatest wish was that awareness and knowledge of his work should continue to grow. So let’s put it this way: in lieu of flowers, introduce a friend to Wolfgang Smith!

Funeral arrangements are unknown at this time. More news should be forthcoming.

On behalf of all his friends and colleagues, we extend our gratitude for your thoughts and prayers.

The work will endure, but we will miss the man. Rest in peace, Herr Professor”.

6. A personal message from the editor.

Wolfgang and his wife, Dr. Thea Smith, attended our T.L.M. twice, The first time while Fr. Alex MacLellan was the priest and the second time, a few years later, Fr. Domotor.. We easily befriended them due, in part, to our European cultural background; a shared language, German, and my great interest in his writings. He would call often on Sunday afternoons and our discussion would typically last a good hour, but sometimes exceeded two hours and once even three hours. Once he called us, simply because he felt lonely. He would not only talk about his latest thinking and reading about science but also about the Germanic cultural and religious life of the past. He was a giant and I was a midget when it came to philosophical thinking but his writing about science was always understandable.

I have no doubt that once sanity returns to this world, his writing will wipe out most of the post 1960 scientific speculations and lead to great advances in our understanding of the universe and of God’s great love for His creation, especially of *homo sapiens*. I may elaborate on this a bit in the next Newsletter.
