## 1. Fr. Kent Grealy, F.S.S.P., celebrating Mass in Victoria

Fr. kent Grealy will be celebrating the Sunday noon-hour Mass on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> September. # 4. Dr. Wolfgang Smith, R.I.P.

In our August newsletter, we hinted at a follow-up news item because of the great importance of Dr. Smith's writings for the future of science once it has been liberated from the shackles of politically-correct atheist thinking. To mention just one revolutionary claim which Dr. Smith made, Albert Einstein's theory of General Relativity (G.R.) is bogus. There was never a reason for introducing that theory into scientific thinking. Furthermore, Einstein knew this full well. Today, he is still revered as the greatest scientist of all time. He invented this G.R. theory to overcome the results of an experiment by Michelson and Morley which proved that the earth is not daily revolving around the sun but is actually not moving at all. It is the only object in the universe that is motionless, which implies that the entire universe rotates around it. As such, the earth is in a privileged position. That strongly suggests a Creator, the Christian God. The vast majority of scientists at that time, and even more so today, did not like this, since they were and are mostly atheists. The Bible teaches that "In the beginning, God created Heaven and earth". Einstein's theory of G.R. negates the results of the Michelson-Morley experiment. Thus the earth has returned to the status of an insignificant planet in an insignificant local system (the solar system of the sun and its surrounding planets) in an insignificant constellation. That is how Carl Sagan explained the st atus of the earth after Einstein's G.R. Unfortunately for him and for all atheists, thanks to Wolfgang Smith's analysis, we are back in that privileged position.

The G.R. theory had other consequences; namely that all matter in the universe was once concentrated in a small sphere which exploded and continues to expand until this day. That happened about 13.8 billion years ago. That is just the result which supporters of Darwin's theory of Evolution needed to strengthen the grounding for that corrupt theory. It explained why we cannot see the appearance of new species in our short life spans. It voided the Biblical creation story and any belief in the literal meaning of its text. That is just what atheists needed. With G.R. now gone, we are back to a literal interpretation of the Bible.

Incidentally, evolution has, since 1998, also been mathematically proven to be impossible given a new mathematical theorem (Complex Specified Information). From that point onwards, Darwinian evolution ceased in truth to be a viable scientific theory. And if evolution be jettisoned, then we are back to design and creation, and to the question of when that might that have occurred. In the 17th century, that question was seriously explored by several people, most importantly by an Irish Bishop, James Ussher, Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland, who died in 1656. He was responsible for calculating the date on which the world was created. He arrived at the year 4004 B.C., and even determined a date of 23<sup>rd</sup> October. Given that calculation, we may celebrate this 23<sup>rd</sup> October the 6,028th anniversary of the creation of the world.

The truth has finally come out. This is just one of Wolfgang Smith's many contributions to science, and it has very important implications for both science and religion.

The birthday of our Lady is fittingly celebrated on 8<sup>th</sup> September, exactly nine months after the feast of her Immaculate Conception.

The feast of St. Michael the Archangel falls this year on a Sunday. Because of its higher ranking than the 19<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost, its celebration takes precedence.
