LITURGY

The season of Advent begins November 30 this year, and continues through December until Christmas. During Advent, there is one major feastday, The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on December 8.

Vestments during Advent are normally purple, marking the time as period for sombre reflection, anticipation and repentance. An exception is made on the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, where rose vestments are worn. Christmas follows as a joyful season, marked by gold or white vestments.
